ry, and have nominated Messrs. Culbreth, Tuck and Keene, on the part of this House, to act with such gentlemen as may be selected by your Honorable Body, to carry into effect the several enactments in relation to that Institution.

Resolved in the affirmative;

The said order was then adopted as amended.

Mr. Eccleston obtained leave to bring in a bill to disfranchise persons convicted of felony;

Ordered, that Messrs. Eccleston, Kerr and Brengle, re-

port the same.

Mr. Buchanan obtained leave to bring in a bill, for the purpose of promoting Education in Allegany county, by means of the Poor School Fund of said county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Buchanan, Smith, Bruce, Alexan-

der and Brengle report the same.

Mr. Brengle obtainee leave to bring in a bill, imposting a tax upon certain stocks, bonds, bills and sther evidence of debt;

Ordered, That Messrs. Brengle, Maulsby and Eccleston

report the same.

Messrs. Tuck and Comegys, the committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Govornor, and inform him that a quorum of the House having convened, were ready to proceed to business, and receive any Communication he might be pleased to lay before them, reported that the Committee had performed the duties of their appointment, and that the Govornor has answered, that he would transmit a Communication to the House to-morrow at 12 o'clock.
