Amend section third by striking out all after the word "enacted" and inserting the following: "That to the owner of every negro slave who shall agree to the enlistment of his slave as above, the sum of one hundred dollars shall be paid when such owner shall file with the proper authority a good and valid deed of manumission of such negro slave so enlisted, which deed of manumission shall be duly recorded, and to the negro fifty dollars when he shall be mustered into service and the like sum when he shall be honorably discharged from service;"
