The President laid before the Senate a report from George H. Williams, Secretary of Baltimore and Havre de Grace Turnpike Company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Also, a communication from the Comptroller covering a report of the school fund;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Eichelberger presented a memorial of the Frederick and Emmitsburg Turnpike Company;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Eichelberger, Carroll and Tome.

Mr. Lankford presented the petition of Thomas Sudler praying relief;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lankford, Ricaud and Rowles.

Mr. Purnell presented the petition of Teagle Townsend;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Finance.

Mr. Ricaud presented the petition of citizens of Kent county against the dredging for oysters.

Mr. Kemp also presented a petition from citizens of Talbot county upon the same subject;

Which were read and referred to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Stirling,

Leave was granted Messrs. Stirling, Tome and Ohr to report a bill to enable the legal and qualified voters of this State, in the service of this State, or of the United States, to exercise the right of suffrage.

On motion of Mr. Stirling,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill to incorporate the South Baltimore Chemical Works.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Leave was granted Messrs. Eichelberger, Carroll and Tome to report a bill as a supplement to the Act to incorporate the Frederick and Emmitsburg Turnpike Company.
