

“An Act to make valid a deed from James B. Cushwa and others, to George Brewer and others;”

Reported it without amendment, and the bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Crane, from the committee on Printing, submitted the following

REPORT:

The committee on Printing beg leave to report that they have contracted with Messrs. Mittag & Sneary, the gentlemen elected printers to this body, for the printing of five hundred copies of the Journal of Proceedings of the Senate, and accompanying Documents, from the commencement to the last of the Session, at a cost not to exceed the sum of one dollar and ten cents per page, of fourteen hundred and fifty ems; the said copies to be printed on paper equal to that used at the last session, and to be delivered in sheets to the State Librarian, within thirty days after the adjournment of the General Assembly. The said Mittag & Sneary, are also required to furnish, daily, to the two Houses, and the State officers designated in the act of 1853, chapter 36, copies of the said Journal, without extra charge therefor; And the printing of Bills and Reports, which may be ordered, during the session, they shall be entitled to receive the same sum, (\$1.10,) per page of 1450 ems, for one hundred and thirty copies, to be distributed according to the act above referred to. For all tabular work, double the above price is to be charged per page of 1450 ems. The said Mittag & Sneary have entered into bonds to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of two thousand dollars, for the proper performance of the above contract. The committee further report that they have contracted with George E. Gambrill for preparing and indexing to the Journal of the Senate, and supervising the proof-sheets of the same, for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars. Said index to be completed within ten days after the adjournment of the General Assembly.
