

THURSDAY, February 11th, 1864.

Mr. Carroll, of Dorchester county, presented a petition from Thomas H. Cobern, asking compensation for services rendered as Captain of Company A, drafted men of the First Congressional district;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Ohr,

Leave was granted Messrs. Ohr, Ricaud and Eichelberger, to report a bill to incorporate the Allegany Land Improvement Company.

Mr. Bayne presented the report of the Judges of the Orphans's Court of Prince George's county;

Referred to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Stirling,

Leave was granted Messrs. Stirling, Lankford and Jenkins, to report a bill to repeal the Act of called session of 1861, authorizing the removal of equity cases in the Superior court and Circuit court of Baltimore from one to the other of said Courts;

Also, a bill to authorize the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church. in the East Baltimore station, to sell and convey certain real estate.

On motion of Mr. Stirling,

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal, that the Senator from Cecil county is absent from imperative private business.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill, entitled, "An Act to repeal section 64, article 75, of the Public General Laws, relating to 'Pleadings, Practice and Process;'"

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Stirling, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill, entitled, "An Act to repeal the 113th section of the 81st article of Public General Laws, relating to 'Revenue and Taxes;'"

Also, a bill, entitled, "An Act to make valid the proceedings of County Commissioners in borrowing money to pay bounties;"
