Mr. Carroll, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the following bills, reported them without amendment, and they were read the second time :

A bill entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Franklin and Powhatan Railway Company;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Maryland Annual Conference College;"

A bill entitled, "An Act to amend an Act to incorporate the Merchants' Hotel Company of Baltimore city, passed at January session, 1860, chapter 348, by enlarging the powers and increasing the capital stock of said company granted by said Act."

Also, reported the bill, entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Union Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore;" with the following amendments :

Fill up the blank in line 6 of section 15, with the word "thirty."

Second amendment.—Insert after the word "another," in the 5th line of the 20th section the following: "And in case of the neglect or refusal of said President and Directors to appoint such assessor within thirty days thereafter, then the person whose property has been injured shall be authorized to appoint both of said assessors ;"

Which were read and adopted, and the bill was read the second time.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, "An Act to release Wm. Price, Thos. J. McKaig, G. W. Brown, G. A. Pearre, and the Cumberland Coal and Iron Company, from liability for certain taxes alleged to be due the State;" reported,

"Said bill ought not to pass;"

Report concurred in and the bill was rejected and returned to the House of Delegates.
