Mr. Crane submitted the following amendment :

Strike out the first four sections and insert :

"SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* The president and board of directors of any steam railroad within the State, be and they are hereby required to have printed and fixed up, in a secure manner, at all their depots, in some conspicuous place, the maximum rates allowed by law both of passage and freight;"

Which was read and adopted.

Amend title by striking out therein these words, "to have compiled, printed and bound all law;"
