Reported "said bill ought not to pass;"

Report adopted, and the bill was rejected and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Crane, from the select committee, reported a bill to legalize the official acts of R. K. Wilson, a justice of the peace for Queen Anne's county;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Given, from the select committee to which was referred the bill entitled, "An Act to authorize the commissioners of Baltimore county to sell certain stock of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore;"

Reported it without amendment; and,

It was read the second time.

Mr. Firey, from the select committee to which was referred the bill to amend section 143 of article 21 of Local Law relating to offenders against the ordinances of the town of Hagerstown;

Reported it without amendment; and

It was read the second time.

Mr. Campbell, from the select committee to which was referred the bill to change the place of voting in Myers' district, Carroll county;

Reported it without amendment, and it was read the second time.
