

“Ought not to pass;”

Which was adopted and the bill rejected ;

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

The following bills which were delivered by the clerk of the House of Delegates on Saturday, were read :

A bill entitled, “An Act to allow Seth W. Warfield, former sheriff and collector of taxes for Howard county, further time to complete his collections ;”

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, “An Act to authorize and empower the commissioners of Baltimore and Howard counties to construct a bridge across the Little Gunpowder Falls between Jericho and Jerusalem Mills, and to levy a sum of money therefor;”

Read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bayless, Given and Carroll.

A bill entitled, “An Act to amend and re-enact section 336 of the 21st article of the Code of Public Local Laws entitled, ‘Washington county,’ relating to witnesses ;”

Read the first time, and referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill entitled, “An Act to incorporate a company to construct a Marine Railway at Shad Point on the Wicomico river, in Somerset county, to be styled the Wicomico Railway Company ;”

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

A bill entitled, “An Act to render valid and legalize all official acts of Joshua S. Naylor, as justice of the peace in Prince George’s county, from November 4th, 1863, to February 22d, 1864 ;”

Read the first time and referred to committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill entitled, “An Act to provide for the payment of the claims of William Thompson, of R. and Richard H. Miles, tobacco commissioners, for their services and expenses ;”

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Finance.

Also, reported that the bill entitled, “An Act to repeal the 51st and 42d sections of article 51 of General Laws, relating to justices of the peace ;”
