

Reported it without amendment, and

It was read the second time.

Mr. Eichelberger moved to make it the Order of the Day for to-morrow at 2 o'clock;

Determined in the affirmative.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a joint resolution authorizing the Governor to expend the surplus of contingent fund for repairs of Government House;
