

THURSDAY, March 10th, 1864.

On motion of Mr. Kemp,

Amend by adding to section 9 the following, "and all investments of said fund or its increments heretofore made by the Treasurer in any such bonds or stock, or stock of the United States, are hereby approved and made valid;"
