

Mr. Hyland, presented the following order:

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal of this House that the absence of Mr. N. P. Douglass from his seat is occasioned by indisposition;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Stockbridge presented the following order:

Ordered, That the bill providing for the presentation of Regimental Flags to certain of the Maryland Regiments be recommitted to the committee by which it was reported to this House, with instructions to consider the propriety of so amending the same as to include within the provisions of said bill such batteries and battalions of this State as have particularly distinguished themselves;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Brown presented the following order:

Ordered, That it be entered upon the Journal of the House, that Messrs. Shaw and Hebb, of the Allegany delegation, and the Reading Clerk, Mr. Shaw, from Allegany, have been prevented from reaching the seat of Government on their return, by the suspension of travel on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, caused by a raid of the rebels upon that road;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Greene presented the following order:

Ordered, That in consequence of the absence of the Reading clerk of this House, detained from his post by an irruption of the rebels upon the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, the Speaker be requested to appoint a Reading Clerk, pro-tem.;

Which was adopted.

The Speaker appointed John McGarigle, in accordance with the above order.

Mr. Lee presented the following order:

Ordered, If James F. Lee had been in his seat on last Thursday, when the vote on the Convention Bill was taken, he would have voted in the affirmative;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Tyson presented the following order:

Ordered, That it be entered upon the Journal, that the absence of James Sykes is occasioned by his attendance on the select committee appointed to visit and inquire into the condition of the State Tobacco Warehouses;
