Mr. Giles presented a petition of Samuel D. Walker and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act to incorporate the proprietors of the Green Mount Cemetry,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund, for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed, "will pass," and ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one the act to incorporate the American Life Insurance and Trust Company, and the several supplements thereto, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;"

Which amendments were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the trustees of school district No. 6, in Kent county, to sell a certain lot of ground therein mentioned, and for other purposes;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Usilton, Welch and Gale.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Chester Town, in Kent county, and for other purposes;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Gale, Welch and McDaniel.

Also, a memorial of James McEvoy, Esq. of the city of Baltimore, containing an answer to certain charges against him in a statement made by the Directors of the Penitentiary of Maryland, and appended to their annual report to the Legislature, endorsed "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on crimes and punishments.
