

Mr. Swingley, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to confirm an act to repeal all that part of the Constitution and Form of Government, as relates to the division of Washington county, into eight separate election districts, and for other purposes, reported the same without amendment,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an additional supplement to an act authorising Henry Shafer, George Shafer, and Henry I Shafer, to distribute their estate by lot, passed at December session 1834, ch. 104,

Also the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act relating to the city of Baltimore, passed at Dec. session 1837, severally endorsed, "will pass" and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered a memorial of the Faculty of Physic of the University of Maryland, calling the attention of the Legislature to their present condition, and soliciting such relief as the Legislature, in the exercise of their wisdom, might deem expedient to extend, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates,"

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Selby, referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Selby, Ghiselin, Giles, Lemmon and White,

Also a communication from the Secretary of the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike-road Company, containing an abstract of the accounts of said company, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates,"

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement;

Also, a petition of John Stoner and others, in relation to a certain road therein mentioned, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates,"

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Geyer, Biser, and Ent;

Also, the following message:

By the Senate,

February 8th, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to proceed immediately to the election of Bank Directors, and concur therein. No additional nominations have been made by the senate. We have appointed Messrs. Goldsborough and Bruce to join the gentlemen named in your message to count the ballots and report the result.
