Mr. Rentch, reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county, to appoint judges, and fix the place of holding the elections in the ninth election district in said county;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, and severally passed.

Mr. Powder reported a bill, entitled, an act to open and lay out a public road in Frederick and Carroll counties.

Mr. Powell, reported a bill entitled, an act to alter the mode of appointing the overseers of the poor of Worcester county, in this State.

Mr. McDaniel reported a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Ann Pennington, of Kent county,

And Mr. White, chairman of the committee on agriculture, reported a bill, entitled, an act to promote for the growth and manufacture of silk,

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Causin reported a bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to the act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others.

Which was read the first and second time by special order and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.
