The question then recurred upon the amendment as offered by Mr. Bowie.

Mr. Simmons, moved to amend said amendment by striking out the words "in lieu of all other compensation,"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Kerr, (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) moved to reconsider the vote of the house just had on the motion of Mr. Simmons to strike out the words, "in lieu of all other compensation,"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Giles moved to amend said amendment by striking out the words "all other compensation," and inserting in lieu thereof these words, "the salary heretofore provided by law,"

Which amendment was accepted by Mr. Bowie.

The question again recurred and was put upon the amendment as offered by Mr. Bowie, and as amended,

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Grason, (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) the house reconsidered their vote on said amendment;

The question was then again put on the amendment as offered by Mr. Bowie, and

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Alexander moved to amend said bill by inserting in the place of the words stricken out, the following,—“at present in office, the sum of four thousand dollars, and to the Governor to be hereafter elected, the sum of five thousand dollars,”

Which was read.

Mr. Giles offered as a substitute for said amendment the following,—“the sum of forty-one hundred dollars, in lieu of the compensation heretofore provided by law,”

Which was read.

Pending these motions,

Mr. Roberts moved that the house adjourn,

Resolved in the affirmative,

And the house accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
