

And a resolution in favor of Anne G. Handy, of Somerset county, endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed,

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act supplemental to the act to incorporate the "Chester Silk Company," passed at Dec. session, 1837.

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

The bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to authorise the chancellor and the several county courts of this State, to order and decree the sale of the real estate of minors in the cases therein mentioned,

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act authorising Henry Feete, surviving executor of Jacob Alexander, late of Frederick county, deceased, to execute the last will and testament of said deceased, passed Dec. session 1836, ch. 214,

And the bill, entitled, an act to confirm an act, entitled, an act providing for the appointment of clerks of the several county courts, the clerks of the court of appeals for the Eastern and Western Shores, the clerk of Ballimore city court, and the registers of wills in the several counties of this State,

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Simmons presented a petition of Philip Pindell and Elizabeth, his wife, praying that the law asked for by Charles Hodges, confirming and making valid certain deeds, may not pass,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Sprigg presented a memorial of Jonathan Barkdoll, of Allegany county, praying the passage of an act authorising a patent to issue to him for a certain tract of land therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, McDaniel, and Causin.

Mr. Sprigg also presented a memorial of a number of contractors on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, setting forth the dissatisfaction existing among the laborers on said canal, and praying the legislature to adopt some decisive measure to place the canal company speedily in funds to meet its engagements,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Giles presented a petition of James I. Pattison and Eleanor Pattison, praying for a divorce,

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Powder presented a petition of sundry citizens of Westminster, praying the passage of a law to lay out and widen an alley adjoining the tavern of David Keefer, in Westminster, in Carroll county,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Beam presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Montgomery and Frederick counties, praying the passage of an act authorising the repair of the Frederick and Rockville road,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.
