B. Williams, treasurer of the trustees of said institution, heard at the first term of the court of appeals,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Maulsby presented a petition of John Carsins, sheriff of Harford county, praying an increase of the per diem allowance for the support and maintenance of prisoners,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, Williams, and Nelson,

Mr. Maulsby also presented a petition of Drucilla Norrington, of Harford county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county, and recommended by thirty-five citizens of said county,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Geyer presented a memorial of Samuel Urner, praying an alteration in the location of a certain road in Frederick and Carroll counties,

Which were read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Bowie presented a petition of Ignatius L. Hardey, of Prince George's county, praying the passage of an act authorising the recording of a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. McDaniel presented a petition of Isaac Bull, of Kent county, praying that the sheriff's sale therein mentioned may be set aside,

And Mr. Parker presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of a law to prevent the distillation of grain into spirituous liquors,
