On motion of Mr. Ely, the title to said bill was amended by striking out "State of Maryland," and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "District of Columbia," and by adding at the end of the title the words, "of the city of Baltimore,"

The said bill was then returned to the senate.

And Mr. White reported a bill, entitled, an act to abolish public executions,

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Risteau reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1836, ch. 255,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and,

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Simpers reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the North-East Navigation Company,

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and

On motion of Mr. McDaniel, referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Turner reported a bill, entitled, an act to regulate the time of holding elections in the several counties and cities in this State,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time and passed.

Mr. McDaniel, from the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act supplemental to the act to incorporate the Chester Silk Company, passed at December session 1837;

Which was read the first time.

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, and passed.
