Determined in the negative.

Mr. Williams moved to amend said resolution by adding at the end thereof the following proviso:

Provided, that the said work shall be completed and be delivered to the State's librarian within fifteen months next after the date of the passage of this resolution.

Which was read.

Mr. Ely moved to amend said amendment by striking out "fifteen months," and inserting in lieu thereof "two years,"

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put on the amendment as amended, and Resolved in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put, will the house assent to the resolution as amended,

Resolved in the affirmative, and the resolution sent to the senate.

Mr. Bowie submitted the following resolution:

Resolved, that so much of the resolution passed at December session 1834, No. 63, as provides for the appointment, by the Governor and Council, of some person or persons to digest and compile the laws of this State, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time.

Mr. Carroll moved to lay said resolution on the table,

Determined in the negative.

Resolved in the affirmative, and the resolution sent to the senate.
