

TUESDAY, January 2d, 1838.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The speaker laid before the house, reports from the clerks of St. Mary's, Washington and Caroline county courts, relative to the attendance of the judges;

Which were read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, a report of the judges of the orphans' court of P. George's county, relative to the school fund of said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Also, reports from the clerks of St. Mary's and Caroline counties, and Baltimore city court, relative to the several sums of money paid by them into the Western Shore Treasury within the year ending on 30th November;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Also, the annual report of the trustees of the University of Maryland, accompanied with a statement of their accounts;

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Queen Ann's county, to insert the date of the year of a deed and acknowledgement,—And,

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the trustees of the Alms-house in Prince George's county, to alter the time of appointing an overseer and other officers and servants of said institution, and for other purposes;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Bowie presented a petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, praying a repeal of the law passed at the last session, relative to the appointment of Tobacco Inspectors;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Merrick, White, Simmons and Shower.

Mr. Dawson presented petitions of Horatio Thompson and Margaret Mark, of Montgomery county, severally praying to be placed on the pension roll of said county;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Griffith presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying for the passage of an act authorising the appointment of weigh-master for live stock in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee on agriculture.

Mr. Ford presented a petition of sundry citizens of St. Mary's county, praying for the erection of a public landing and a public road therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ford, Crane and Hope-well.
