

Mr. Huddleson submitted the following order,

Ordered, that His Excellency the Governor, be respectfully requested to cause the Flag of our Country to be displayed at the top of the State House steeple on Monday the 8th inst. and to cause a federal salute to be fired at 12 o'clock (noon) of said day, in commemoration of the victory achieved by the American forces over the enemy, on the 8th day of January, 1815;

Which was twice read.

Mr. Carroll moved to lay said order on the table;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred upon the adoption of the order;

Mr. Bowie moved to amend said order, by adding at the end thereof, the following:

"And also on the 4th, 5th and 6th days of November next, in commemoration of the great Whig victory in New York;"

Which was read.

Mr. Townsend moved to amend the amendment by adding at the end thereof, the following:

"And the victories obtained by the sovereign people throughout the States of North Carolina, Rhode Island, New Jersey, Ohio, Kentucky and Massachusetts, in opposition to the successor of the Hero of New Orleans,"

Which was read.

Mr. Carroll moved to lay the order and amendments on the table;

Resolved in the affirmative.
