Mr. McDaniel reported a bill, entitled, an act relating to manufactures, and venders of coaches, gigs and other carriages of pleasure, and

Mr. Alexander reported a bill, entitled, an act, relating to mortgages;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Hopewell, reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Leonard Town Steam Mill Manufacturing Company.

Mr. Alexander reported a bill, entitled an act to amend and reduce into one the act to incorporate the life insurance and trust company, and the several supplements thereto;

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Hughes reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise William Penn to bring into this State, a negro slave for life;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on colored population.

The bill reported by Mr. Risteau, entitled, an act to authorise the election of judges of elections, and constables of Baltimore county by the people, was taken up for consideration, and read the second time;

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass,

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Risteau, the yeas and nays were ordered and appeared as follows:—
