And now is with the same day and year before his said Lordships Justices came here unto Court as well the petitioner aforesaid, as the sd. Charles Marchmont in his proper person, and the petition aforesaid being read and heard, and fully understood, and the severall allegations of either party, being by the Court heard, and mature deliberation thereupon had, It seemeth to the Justices here that the Indenture by which the said Henry Hook is hold as an apprentice is a good Indenture &c.

Wherefore it is Considered by the Justices here, that the sd. Henry Hook, Return home with his Master, Charles Marchmont, and serve out his Indented time, pursuant to said Indenture, and that the said Charles Marchmont comply with that part of the Indenture by which he had undertaken to perform &c.
