I would have you sett forth a portion of Town Land for Capt. Giles Brent Esq^r Containing to the quantity of Sixty Acres or thereabouts lying nearest together about the Smiths Forge lately built by the said Giles Brent and for so doing this shall be your Warrant Signed

Sett forth for Mr. Giles Brent Esq^r &c a portion of Town Land lying nearest together about the Smiths Forge lately built by the said Giles Brent whereof the North bounds beginning at a Marked Tree on the Top of the Hill on the South side of a Swamp called the Key Swamp and running by a straight East line above the End of the said Swamp is laid out for One hundred and five Perches the East side beginning at the End of the said hundred and five Perches and running thro the Forrest by a straight South line is laid out for One hundred and ten Perches the South side beginning at the End of the said hundred and ten Perches and running by a straight line West North West (or near that point) to the Course of a Cove now hedged in by the said Giles Brent and along that Hedge to the bank of St. Georges River is laid out for One hundred and ten Perches and the West side along the bank of St. Georges River to the aforesaid Marked Tree is laid out for Eighty Perches or thereabouts so that the whole Area thereof containeth to the Quantity of Sixty three Acres or thereabouts

I know ye that we for and in Consideration that Giles Brent Esq^r Treasurer and one of the Councill of our Province hath adventured himself in person and at his own Charge in the Years of our Lord 1637 and 1638 hath Transported into our said Province eleven Men servants to plant in our said Province have according to the Tenor of our Letters under our hand and seal dated at Warrer Castle in the Realm of England 29th of August 1636 Granted &c lying nearest together about the Housing lately built by the said Giles Brent Sett forth for Sixty and some odd Acres of English Measure be it more or less Counting on the South with the Town land of his Sisters Margaret and Mary on the West with St. Georges River on the North by a straight East line drawn from the top of the Hill on the Southern side the Swamp called the Key Swamp to above the End of the Swamp. On the East with St. Marys Forrest and all Woods &c Yrildinges at our usuall receipt Fifteen pence in Money Sterling or the Commodities &c ut Supra.

Mr. Ferdinando Pulton Demandeth Land due by Conditions of Plantation under these severall Titles following that is to say for men brought in by the severall persons whose Assignors the said Ferdinando Pulton is and for Men brought in in his own right.
