Extract of a letter from Baltimore, dated April 24, 1783. 44 We had our elections a fortnight ago, and 64 toderalists are chosen out of 76, if all keep the promises made at the hustings. Baltimore and Harford counties alone are clearly antifæderal, in which are many powerful and popular men, who have speculated deeply in British conficeted property, and for that reason are alarmed at shutting the door against State Paper Money. The fame men, their relations and particular friends, are more violently antiliaderal, because they paid considerable sums into the treasury in a depreciated continental currency, and are scared at the sweeping clause All treaties m. de and to be made, and laws enacted in " pursuance thereof, fail be the law of the land, however re-46 pugnant to the co.fl.tution and laws of any particular flare,"--which may bring about a due execution of the treaty between Great-Britain and America, to their luft. All those men are unanimous against the fæleral government; they are here called the Black Lift, by way of emphatical distinction. Anne-Arundel county, though naturally fæderal, have elected four antitæleralins, owing to the popular election eering talents of Mr. Chafe, who has represented ibem for twenty years. I am forry he kept out Mr. Carroll, if Carrollton, one of our first rate characters. Mellis. Para and Martin were oblised to go to Harford to be chofen, for neither they nor Mr. Chase could possibly have been chusen in their own places of residence. Dr. M'Henry was chosen by a large majority of votes for this town, because of his federalilm, altho' opposed by Mestrs. M'Mechan and Sterett, two very Popular men, but unfortunately on the wrong fide of the queftion. Mr. Chase is antisæderal, both from ambition, because he cannot expect to be so powerful in the general government as he is in the flate, and because his fartered eireumftances render him interested in discord and a civil war. Not a single antisaderalist is chosen from the whole eastern fliore, or any other county except the three aboven entioned. You can have no conception of the low arts made use of in those three counties to poison the commonalty .- Standing armies, whipping the militia, and all the other infirmmatory realine to copiculty held up to public view in the diffent of jour turbulent Minority.
