Extract of a letter from Richmond to a gentleman in Portsmouth, dated Monday 29th April.

" Accounts by this night's stage fav, that the Convention of Maryland are fixty two to twelve in favour of the New Constitution. Satisfied with the propriety of adopting the Fæderal fystem they far nothing but by their wishes in favour of it .-- Chase and Mercer nte most violent in opposition .---A correspondent remarks that the two last gentlemen, from a simi-Lirity of fentiments and circumstances, are evidently links in the chain of a certain celebrated Orator, whose views have long since been pointed to disunion and separated confederations; the nulla redemptum virtute of Horace is a character that philosophers have doubted the possible existence of.
