Arthur Bryan to ?, Annapolis, 28 March 1788

I arrived on Friday 2 oClock and propose going on to Bladensburgh today Coud not procure the Tan and Grubbing The broad hoes are sent by this Opportunity. Oranges we have none and the Shoes for Miss Betsy If to be had will bring over with me. Your papers &c and a Letter from Mr. Muir is also under Cover advising the Terms on which he is disposed to buy your Wheat and on no other Terms can he think of buying. Complains much of the disappointment from a Confidence that a Considerable paymt would have been made ere Under an Assurance of your punctuality he has no doubt but the Goods sent for in Septr. last will be shipped. -- The Letter for Mrs. Lloyd he knows nothing about -- nor does he recollect of having recd. such a Letter from any one. Wishes to know your determination about the Wheat by return of Wells

or Thorpe. It is said Wheat in Baltimore of the 1st. Quality will command 6/4 from Elk I have heard nothing, Bacon is a dull sale in Market at 9 d. P lb--and the quantity on hand so greatly exceeds the Consumption that Unless a Considerable exportation takes place I am well assurd it will not be higher any time this Season Mutton 7 d. P lb Wells goes over on the Schooner and if he likes means to Buy 15 or 20 [Weathers?] Thorpe is owing him Money and as he expects so much discounted it is possible 37/6 might be got for the wethers deliverd here but the scarcity of Money is such that 35/ had better be taken than miss the Sale. Thorpe also goes Over but finding his business was more bent upon receiving Money than going to Work and talking of making but a short stay advised him to take over a [drayman?] or I knew not the case of her going I can get no intelligence of Your Goods but as

Williams's packet Sailed from this last Week and will probably touch at George Town I think it probable they will be forwarded to this place by that Conveyance.

Have sent the pattent of the Addition; It does not appear that the Original Survey on Lloyds [Costen?] was Vacated A New Pattent on the resurvey issued to Wm. Elbert recites their was a deficiency upon Lloyds [Costen?], Grantham, and 2 Other Tracts of Land included in the resurvey and for which Pattent was granted to Elbert as one entire Tract. Gibson obtaind a pattent on Chance which is not yet Vacated altho by a plott returnd of a resurvey on Chance called Gibsons Discovery it should seem nothing at Chance was left. A pattent cannot Issue on Gibsons Discovery before the 28th Instant. I have not been able after making the most diligent search to find that a recovery was sufferd on the Lands sold by

Banbury and Wife that part of Hopton Containing 45 [A?] included in the resurvey of Mr. Bennetts Called Badwells Indian Creek was Escheated and is so ruited in the Pattent. I can find nothing on the Rent roll that will put me in a way to trace the Entail on Declors Gift nor can I find a Will or record either in the Name of Costen or Woolman that has any reference to this Land. Upon inquiry I have my doubts whether Cranford woud suit you. I am told he is very much Conceited pert and Assuming and fond of Shifting and Changing. I have said nothing to him on the subject therefore he is still at Your service when You come over should you approve of him. The Decree not made out against Hollands Mortgage the Chancellor has promised to sign as soon as Mr Jennings draws it up, and this will not be sooner than Monday so that if the business on the E shore will allow [---] time to go into Calvert I must first

return to Annaps. in order to get the necessary information and Credentials and this I expect will not be sooner than Thursday.
