Mayor-elect Theodore Keldin will take the oath of office at noon tomorrow, just twenty vears and three days after his first inaugural.

The oath will be administered to Mr. McKeldin by James F. Carney, clerk of the Superior Court, in elaborate ceremonies at War Memorial Plaza.

Mr. McKeldin, the only Repub-lcan to serve as Mayor since 1931, has two terms as Governor since his first inaugural in 1943.
