B'rith Sholom To Decorate Former State Senator's Grave At Hagerstown.

ADOLPH KRES HEADS ORDER

Officers Elected At Closing Session Of Twelfth Annual Convention.

Mr. Kennedy, a State Senator from the Hagerstown district in the latter part of the nineteenth century, sponsored the so-called Jew bill, which gave Jews the right to hold public office and commissions in the State Militia.
