truly perform the Office of Administrator of Leonard Covington
late of Prince Georges County, deceased. according to law
and shall in all respects discharge the duties of him required
by law as Administrator aforesaid without any injury or
damage to any person interested in the faithful perform-
ance of said office then the above obligation to be void
it is otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue
in law. —
