# PATRICIA HUGHES, WIFE OF GOVERNOR HUGHES, MARYLAND

Since becoming First Lady of Maryland, Patricia Hughes has continued her involvement in the areas of promotion of women's causes, the support of the arts and historic preservation, and the sponsorship of foreign exchange and educational and public service endeavors.

Mrs Hughes actively supports women's causes. She makes periodic visits to battered spouse programs, career counseling centers for displaced homemakers, shelters for homeless women and centers for drug abuse and alternative schools. She travels statewide to speak as an advocate for such diverse causes as the Consumer Council, the Hispanic Women's Conference, and the Maryland Volunteer Network. She has worked on behalf of the League of Women Voters, the Maryland Commission for Women, the Women's Caucus, the United Democratic Women's Club, Business and Professional Women, the Maryland Federation of Jewish Women, and Women in State Service, as well as the National Organization of Women Legislators and the Regional Women's Bankers group.

Mrs. Hughes has been an avid supporter and promoter of the arts. She initiated and organized a benefit dinner for Center Stage, Maryland's State Theatre, on whose board she serves. A strong proponent of the Maryland State Arts Council, she originated the program for rotating art exhibits of Maryland artists in the Governor's Reception Room and presents scholarship awards on the Council's behalf. She was Chairwoman of the Women's Committee for the Preview of the exhibit "More than Land and Sky-Art from Appalachia" at the National Museum of American Art, Smithsonian Institution, a show which will tour the 13 Appalachian states during a two year period.

Mrs Hughes is Chairperson of Friends of Government House (the Governor's residence) and her active participation includes organizing programs and giving lectures to raise private funds for the reinstallation of the public rooms of Government House. She works with the Maryland Historical Society Gallery Committee to ensure that each of the rooms reflects authentically a different historical period in Maryland featuring only Maryland furnishings and art works.

In 1979, Governor and Mrs. Hughes were hosts to a twelve member Chinese delegation, thus establishing the first state-province sister relationship between the United States and China. As members of the resultant trade mission, they spent two weeks in China in June, 1980, as guests of Vice Premier Wan Li. A member of the Board of the Baltimore Council of International Visitors, she actively participates in the promotion of Japanese and French sister state relationships with Maryland.

Mrs. Hughes was a member of the University of Maryland Graduate Schools' Task Force on Aging, an interprofessional group which organized programs, planned agendas, and secured speakers. Other educational and public service endeavors include work for the American Cancer Society (as '79-'80 Maryland Chair), the Heart Association, the Council for Exceptional Children and the Annual March of Dimes.
