## **Judge Joins Circuit Court**

■ Montgomery County District Court Judge Louise G. Scrivener has been appointed to fill the Circuit Court seat left vacant by the retirement of Chief Judge William M. Cave.

Gov. Parris N. Glendening (D) announced the appointment yesterday, saying Scrivener "has a proven reputation as a hard-working and conscientious jurist."
