day of last week. But among many persons who have followed the case closely, it is thought that Snowden is innocent of any connection with the crime and further-thore, in many quarters, it is not be-lieved that a negro committed the horrible affair.

Snowden was submitted to a severe grilling at the hands of the several de-tectives, State's Attorney Green, stilling at the uncertives. State's Attorney sheriff Sullivan and other police officials last night. His examination lasted about three hours. And it was stated by the officials that they feel they have the party guilty of the crime.
