

A COLORED LAWYER.

Richard E. King, the colored man who was admitted to practice in the Court of Appeals today, resides in St. Mary's county. He formerly lived in Charles county, but left there some years ago for Boston, where he studied law. He had also been a school teacher. On returning home a short time ago he was admitted to the bar in St. Mary's county, and subsequently in Charles county, the latter by certificate from St. Mary's Court. He has a very dark complexion. He was admitted to the Court of Appeals on motion of State's Attorney Munroe, of Anne Arundel county. There have only been two colored men admitted to practice in the Court of Appeals, the other one being Everette J. Waring, who was admitted April 11, 1888, on motion of John L. Thomas.
