State House, Annapolis, and was also a member of the commisison that erected the State Armory in this city. He was first elected to the Senate in 1907. Four years later he was reelected. He was a member of the House of Delegates at the session of 1901. His long service in the Legislature brought him recognition throughout the State, and at different times he sponsored and had enacted numerous constructive laws. He was mentioned as a candidate for Congress, but serving his constituents in the Legislature seemed to appeal to him more than the Congressional field. In 1908 he was vice-president of the Maryland delegation to the Republican National Convention at Chicago. He was a son of the late Philip Mathias and was born on a farm near Creagerstown. After a private and public school education he became a traveling salesman for a Baltimore firm and later became
