Beall having agreed to pay me the sum of eighty pounds current money I Relinquish all my right title and claim to Negro Rachel & her son Robert unto Mr Zedekiah Swann of Montgomery County my right to the which negroes is under a Bill of Sale from Joseph Compton Sen^r and Joseph Compton Jun^r dated 16 day of April 1799 redeemable on or before 16 day of April 1801
