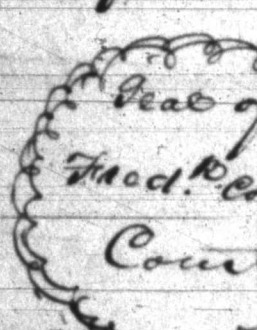

At the request of John W. Porter the following deed was recorded 10th March 1824
This deed of bargain and sale made the 29th of November eighteen hundred and twenty three between George Gasparway of Frederick County in the state of Maryland of the one part and John W. Porter of the same County and state of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Gasparway for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars money of the United States to him in hand at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold aliened released reposed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release repossess and confirm unto him the said John W. Porter his heirs and assigns forever all those lots or portions of ground situate and being in the town of Brodsville in Montgomery County in the state of Maryland distinguished on the general plot of said town as surveyed by Richard Thomas by lot No forty four forty five and forty six to have and to hold the said lots with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and he the said George

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Gaspaway doth hereby for himself his heirs executors and administrators covenant and grant to and with the said John W. Porter that he the said George Gaspaway the said lots or portions of ground hereby granted with all and singular the rights manners and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said John W. Porter his heirs and assigns forever against him the said George Gaspaway and his heirs and against all manner of persons whatsoever claiming the same by through or under him or his heirs will warrant and forever defend by these presents in testimony whereof he the said George Gaspaway hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year herein before written - Signed sealed and delivered in presence
