This Indenture made this eleventh day of march in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty two between Joseph E. Bentley of Montgomery county and state of Md
land of the one part and John A. T. Kilgour of the county and state of said of the other
part Whereas on application of the said Joseph E. Bentley to the Judges of Montgomery
County Court for the benefit of the act of assembly for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors the
said Court on the eleventh day of March eighteen hundred and twenty two was pleased
to appoint the above named John A. T. Kilgour trustee on behalf of the creditors of the
said Joseph E. Bentley and to direct that the said Joseph E. Bentley should execute a deed
to the said trustee for all his property debts rights and claims excepting the necessary wear
ing apparel and bedding of himself and family in trust for the said creditors of the said
Joseph E. Bentley Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Joseph E. Bentley in pursu
ance of an order of the said Court and to obtain the benefit of the said act of

assembly and in consideration of the sum of one dollar current money to him paid
by the said John A. T. Kilgour at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold assigned transferred
and set over and by these presents doth freely and absolutely grant bargain and sell
assign transfer and set over unto the said John A. T. Kilgour his heirs executors and
administrators all and every the household goods and furniture effects and chattels
debts and sums and sums of money belonging to and due and owing to the said
Joseph E. Bentley as are in the schedule of the said Joseph E. Bentley heretofore
filed in the said Court particularly mentioned and also all other property real per
sonal and mixed of what kind nature or quality soever excepting the wearing appa
rel and bedding of the said Joseph E. Bentley and his family that the said Joseph
E. Bentley has or claims any title to or he is in any respect entitled to in possession
remainder or reversion to have and to hold the same and every part and parcel thereof
unto him the said John A. T. Kilgour and his executors administrators and assigns
forever in trust for the said creditors of the said Joseph E. Bentley and for their ben
efit agreeable to the act of assembly entitled An act for the relief of sundry insolvent
debtors In witness whereof the said Joseph E. Bentley hath hereunto set his hand and
affixed his seal the day and year first above mentioned Signed sealed and delivered
in the presence of Wm Scott Thos M. Winson Jos E Bentley

At the request of Rezin Orme the following deed was recorded 12th March 1822
This Indenture made the eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty two Between Josiah W. Redman of Montgomery county in the
State of Maryland blacksmith of the one part and Rezin Orme of the City of Washington
in the District of Columbia timber merchant of the other part Witnesseth that the said
Josiah W. Redman for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars
of lawful money of the United States of America to him in hand paid by the said
Rezin Orme above before the execution of these presents the receipt whereof to the
said Josiah W. Redman doth hereby acknowledge and thereof and from every
part and parcel thereof doth acquit release and discharge the said Rezin Orme
his heirs executors administrators and assigns in the said Josiah W. Redman hath
granted bargained sold aliened infeoffed and confirmed and by these presents
doth grant bargain sell alien infeoff and confirm unto the said Rezin Orme his heirs
and assigns All that part of two tracts of land lying and being in Montgomery county
aforesaid the one called "Two Farms" and the other called "Beale Christie" beginning
for the same at a marked white oak the beginning tree of part of a tract of land
called new purchase and running thence reversed with new purchase north
fifty six and three quarters degrees West twenty nine and an half perches to a stone
the end of the first line of Beale Christie then reversed with said line north eight degrees
west fifty nine perches to a stone then south forty four and an half degrees east thirty
two perches then south thirty four degrees east twelve perches south twenty five and an
half degrees east ten perches south thirty five degrees east twenty seven perches to a
line drawn north fifty nine and an half degrees from the aforesaid white oak thence
with a straight line to the beginning containing and now laid out for two acres of land
more or less to have and to hold the aforesaid land and premises hereby bargained and sold
with the improvements thereon unto the said Rezin Orme his heirs and assigns
to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Rezin Orme his heirs and
assigns forever and the said Josiah W. Redman for himself his heirs executors
and administrators doth covenant grant and agree to and with the said Rezin Orme
his heirs executors administrators or assigns that he the said Josiah W. Redman
his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall and lawfully may from time
to time and at all times hereafter peaceably and quietly have hold use occupy
possess and enjoy the aforesaid land and premises hereby granted and confirmed
with their due every of their appurtenances freely clearly and absolutely discharged
