Soon after, Holloren was taken up and imprison'd for another Robbery, and being closely examin'd by Mr. Keen's Son, some Circumitances of his being concern'd in the Murder, occuring, he at last consessed the Whole:—Upon which they were all taken up, tried and convicted; and Power, with his Wise, Holloren and McGuire, were executed, and the Bodies of the Two last hung up in Chains.—The others are reprieved till his Majesty's Pleasure
