Who To faw the Tracks of the kinemy, supposed them to be about Forty, and seemed to be directing their Course towards Carlisle.—That upon this Information Colonel Armstrong ordered Captain Lindsay, with a strong Party, to range in the Valleys, and endeavour to fall in with the Indians, while other Parties were employed in ranging along the Foot of the Mountain; so that it was thought scarcely probable the Savages could get in among the Inhabitants, without meeting with our Men: But that many of the People, however, near the Foot of the Mountain, had moved-lower down; and that the Diffress and Confusion this Party occasioned on the Frontiers, at this Season, was very great, as they were about putting in their Spring
