A Handmill Stone was taken off by Violence of the Wind, carried a confiderable Diffance, and broke to Pieces. [Ob! Predigions!] An Iron Fire-Dog carried out of the Chimney, upwards of 40 Yards. [Here must bave been a very strong Chimney ] The Top of a Pigeon House sell right down, and the Body of it, was carried upwards of fix Yards diffant. Part of the Roof of the Fowl House [not the foul House,] has been found upwards of two Miles off; and confiderable other Damage has been done on the Place by this Wind. One Charles Katter, who lived in a finall House on the Plantation, on hearing the Noise of the Wind, went out of Doors, and was much hurt by the Fall of Part of the House; he lest within Doors his Wife, and 6 or 7 Children, with a Traveller, who all escaped unhurt: One of the Boards of the upper Chamber Floor of the Mansion House how stands upright, one End sunk upwards of two Feet in the Ground.
