HE Regency of Tripoli has given Salt to the Value of 10,000 fequins, and other Goods to the Amount of 4000, and refitted the Ships belonging to the Squadron which we fent there, by their Corfairs did our Subjects. They faluted our squadron with 27 Gans when it entered the Port of Tripoli, and the Senator Neny, who commanded it, was treated with great Honouri by the Bey: This Squadron will leave Tripoli the 22d Inftant, in Order to seturn hither.

The Senate has rewarded the Commander Nany, by creating him a Knight of the Golden Star; and our Conful at Tripoli with a Present of 1000 Sequins, befides a Penfion of 100 Sequins per Annam, for his Behaviour upon this Occasion.

Paris, Sept. 27. Since the unfortunate Expedition of Larache, an Exchange of the Prisoners which fell into the Hands of the King of Morocco harbeen Negociacing, and we were in Hopes was almost brought to a happy Couclusion; but we have lately received 'Advice, that the Barbarian King will not liften to any reasonable Proposition, that he expects to have all our Prisoners redeemed stonce, and demands a Ranfom of \$8,000 Livres for each of them.
