We are made happy by learning, that your Majesty had no reason to apprehend that the peace, which we at present enjoy, will be disturbed by our being any wife involved in the calamittes of war, which still unhappily prevail in one part of Europe.

Your Majesty's paternal care in recommending to us a due vigilance in the use of every precaution to preferve this country from that most dreadful contagion, from which, under the Divine Providence, it has been hitherto our happiness to remain free, calls for our sincerest acknowledgments; and commands our utmost

attention. 5

We beg leave to assure your Majesty, that our most diligent endeavours shall be employed to frame such laws, as shall, in our judgment, tend to supply the defects, and remedy the abuses, which may appear to have been introduced in any branch of the various and extensive concerns of this courtry; and we look upon your Majesty's gracious assurance of your ready concurrence, in whatever may best contribute to the attainment of those salves and a salvest proof of the desire, which has constantly been shewn, by your Majesty, to promote the welfare of your people.

It is with unfeigned Joy we beg Leave to offer to Your Ivinjesty our Congratulations on the Buth of another Prince, and on the happy Recovery of the Queen, who is still more endeated to this Nation, by every new Pledge of Security for the Happiness we enjoy under Your Mojesty's auspicious Government, as, well as by Her Majesty's anniable Virtues.

Care, in the Precautions Your Majesty has taken to preserve this Kingdom from the infectious Sickness with which we have if late been alarmed; and though we have the Satusfaction to find that, by the Besting of Providence, the Danger of its spreading is now diminished, we will not be negligent, on our Part, in taking such Measures as may from Time to Time appear best calculated to secure this Nation from the Vistation of so dreadful an Evil.
