B. it enaded, by the General Affembly of Maryland,
That William Marbury be agent of this thate, to
execute the trust and power reposed in him-by virtue of
this act, from the first day of Jonuary, one thousand
ieren hundred and ninety-nine, until the first day of
lanuary, one thousand eight hundred.

It did be it enatted, that the said agent superintend
the collection of all arrearages and balances due from
the siveral collectors of the respective countries within
this start; and the said agent is hereby authorised and

the invertal collectors of the respective counties within this fite; and the faid agent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the treasurers of the respective mores for an accurate the temperature of all arrearages and banness due from such collectors, and such accounts that he furnished by the faid treasurers accordingly.

Use And be it enalled. That the faid agent be authorized to respect to a collection of balances due to

IV. And be it enacted, That the faid agent be authorized to superintend the collection of all mones due to the finite for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures and amerciaments, and forfeited recognizances, and the ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to require payment, and, if necessary, sue for and recover the same; and the said agent may allow for in Olyencies, and credit any money that the party is not chargeable with by law, and for his information of the law, he may take the advice of the attorney-general in

And be it enasted, That whenever there shall be cocalion to expote to public fale the property of any co effor, or his fecurities, by virtue of any execution aready issued, or to be usued for this purpose, the hid areasy flued, or to be flued to this purpose, the but agent fluit cause at least thirty days public notice to be given of such take, and shall artend the same, and if it shall appear that there is danger of losing any part of the debt due to the state, and not therwise, shall purchise any property so exposed to file for the use of the of the arranges due by the collectors whose property may be so purchased, and that no purchase authorited by this act shall be considered as made on the part of the state, unless a public declaration to that effect be made by the agent, or his deputy immediately after fuch (iie and purchafe; and any property to purchafed for the use of the state, the said agent may again expose to public auction on the most advantageous terms, for to ublic audition on the most advantageous terms, for the use of the state, and it the same or fold on credit, which shall in no case exceed the term of two years, the suidagent shall take bond, with good and sufficient security, to be approved of by the treaturer of the western shore, from the purchasers of such property, and all bonds by him so taken shall be deposited, with an accurate list thereof subscribed by him, in the treasury of the western shore, and shall be a lien upon the real property of such purchasers, and their securities, from the respective dates, or so much thereof as is mentioned in the schedule thereto annexed. in the ichedule thereto annexed.

VI. And be it enaded, That the faid agent is hereby directed to dispose of all confidented British property that remains unfold, and take bonds to the state, with officient fecurity, and give time for the payment thereof, not exceeding two years from the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and nin-ty nin-, and
that where the quantity of land in any one body subfed to fuch fale exceeds the quantity of fifty acres, such land shall be disposed of at public sale, of the time and place of which fale at least thirty days previous notice shall be given by public advertisement; and that at the time of any sale by virtue of this act, the said agent field make known that he only fells the right of this flate thereto, and that the flate doth not guaranty the file to the fame, or any part thereof, but that the purchase must be in all respects at the risk of the purchase

VII. And be it enalled, That no payment in future by any officer or perion indebted to the flate shall be valid and effectual, unless made to the treasurer of the medern or eastern fliore, or to the agent for the time being, or unless made to the clerks and theriffs of the leteral counties, in the cases where the said clarks and

terral counties, in the cases where the said cterks and that are by law authorised to receive the same.

VIII. And be it engled. That the agent shall have full power and authority, by and with the advice of the governor and council, in all cases of uninstalled debts, so that back any property heretofore purchased by any person, and not yet paid for, in cases where the person having purchased, and his securities, are not capable of parting starting for the same of paying for the lame, and to compromise the same upon terms and principles of equity and juffice, by and

with the advice and confent aforefaid; and the agent is hereby tequired to lay a particular statement of his proceedings under this section before the next session

of affembly.

1X. And be it enalled, That the agent, with the approbation and confent of the governor and council, be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to compronife any fuit depending in chancery with any state debtor, upon any terms in their judgment calculated to promote the interest of the state, and to obtain the fpeedy receipt of the fums aue.

X. And be it enalled, That if, under the terms of any compromite made as aforefaid, the property here-to-ore purchased should be taken back and revested in the state, the same may be fold by the sgeat, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to sell the same at hereby authorised and empowered to sell the fame at public fale, giving thirty days notice, on a credit of two years, payable one half of the principal, and the whole interest, annually, on the first day of December in each year, and the bonds, when taken, shall be returned to the treatury of the western shore, and reported to the general affembly at their tesson next entuing the taking of such bonds.

XI. And be it enalled, That all cases in chancery, where no compromite under this act is effected, shall be passed under the direction of the agent, who is hereby

praced under the direction of the agent, who is hereby authorited and requires to call on the attorney-general to profecute or defend the same to immediate final decition; and the governor and council are hereby authorifed and empowered, at the request of the agent, in cases of difficulty, to aid the attorney general, by employing any person to attend to surveys where necessary, or otherwise to affile in the profession or defence or fail fulls, which person or persons are to be paid out of the contingent fund of five hundred pounds; and the names of the persons so employed, together with the turn allowed for their fervices, to be fail before the general affembly at their pext fellion.

KII. And be it enalted, That if any bond debtor to the flate for conflicted property purchased, or otherwise, shall neglect to make payment agreeably to the condition of his bond, and fundry referees of the general affembly, the said agent finds caste process to Muse for the whole principal and interest them then, or shall proceed on any execution already iffued, and terred and suspended, as occasion may require, or, under the direction and with the approbation of the governor and council, he is hereby authorifed to delay any execution as long as they may think expedient and necessary.

XVII. And be it enalled, That in all cases where bonds shall be taken in vertue of this act, the bonds shall be a lien on all the real property of the oblicers.

CONSTANTINOPLE, November 5 of Bourbon and Ide de France, have thrown of their dependence on the French republic, and torced the republican ipuadron of admiral Serey to leave their harbours. This measure is faid to proceed from a very active communication between, the Iffe de France and the commodore of the British squadron in that quarter, through the medium of captain Lofack, of the ship Juniter.

HAMBURG, December 8.

Extrad of a letter from Vienna, November 21.

The divan of Conflantinople, it is faid, have refolved to declare war against the Batavian republic, in which case its effects in Turkey would meet with the fame fate as those of the French. But the lateft advices from thence mention no fuch proceeding.

Accounts from Palermo, of October 18, fay that the French garrison in La Valette, on Malta, fallied forth several hundred men, but the Maltese being ambuscaded the French got between two fires, and after a hard fought battle, in which even the former lott one hundred men, the latter were entirely cut On the 17th of October, agreeably to orders from admiral Nelson, sour English frigates failed from the harbour of Trappani in Sicily, to re-inforce the fquadron before Malta, and fent orders to the Portuguele commodore to bombard that part of the illand in the pollession of the French. A Danish ship laden with 120 oxen and provisions, and fent by the bey of Tripoli to Malta, was on her return captured by the Portuguele squadron and carried to Syracuse.
