THE CACADOR.

A Story of the Peninsular War. When Lord Wellington retired behind the lines of Torres Vedras, I was in command of a company of Cacadores, or Portuguese ligh infanty, having like many British officers, ac cepted promotion in the Portuguese service My subalterns were two brothers, youn Scotchmen, whom I shall cail Cameron. The were both fine, amiable and brave young mer butthe youngest was one of the noblest, frees most gallant and generous spirits I ever be

At the time we entered the Portuguese se vice, the regiments were little more than sk letons; but recruits flocked in in crowds, ar were speedily organized into battalions, und the British officers and non-commissioned of ficers, who formed, as it were, the nucleus the corps. Among the men who joined from the country, was a young peasant of bout twenty years old, whose father's crage was within a musket shot of our lines. He was peculiarly quick, active and inte-gent; and rapidly became what is termed a zy smart soldier, and was soon promoted to a corporal. This lad was, indeed, one of most superior persons of his class I ever r with. His attention to his duty, and the sm ness and precision with which it was perfor ed, were equally remarkable.
