 by the name and description of his the said Richard Friesby's Failey Estate  
 Situated and lying at the mouth of Failey Creek and on the South side  
 thereof in Kent County and State aforesaid, Containing about Eleven hundred  
 Acres be the same more or less, also forty valuable Slaves, namely, Failey  
 Harry, Hark, Haleup, Bill, Ned, Emory, Richard, Albert, Phil, Charles, Jim bottom  
 Frank, Dick, Black Dick, Sam, Amys, Harry, Henry, Parnet, Yellow Jim,  
 Frederick, Joe, Bill, Lydia, Jim, Isaac, Stephen, Ben, Darkey Lydia, Amy,  
 Maria, Alley, Ann, Louisa, Sarah, Helly, Eliza, Jane, Vance Mary, Ann, Maria,  
 and Anna Maria, - and also the following live stock, Chattels and property
