Whereas by Indentures bearing date on or about the fourth day of August in the year of Our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and Nineteen, and made between the above named Richard Frisby of the one part, and Samuel Hollingsworth and Henry Thompson of the aforesaid City of Baltimore of the other part, it is Witnessed, that for the purpose of securing a Debt or sum of money owing from the said Richard Frisby to the President Directors and Company of the City Bank of Baltimore aforesaid and the interest thereof at the times and in manner therein and herein after expressed, and for the further Consideration therein mentioned, the said Richard Frisby did give, grant, bargain and sell, alien enfeoff, convey, Assign, transfer, set over and confirm unto the said Samuel Hollingsworth and Henry Thompson their heirs and assigns, All and singular the Lands and Real Estate, Slaves, Effects and Property therein and herein after described or mentioned of him the said Richard Frisby, that is to say all that Farm, plantation or tract of Land known by the name and description of his the said Richard Frisbys Fairlie Estate Situated and lying at the mouth of Fairlie Creek and on the South side thereof in Kent County and State aforesaid, containing about Eleven hundred Acres be the same more or less; also forty valuable Slaves, namely, Fairlie Harry, Mark, Galeys, Bill, Ned, Emory, Richard, Albert, Phil, Charles, Jim Cotton, Frank, Dick, Black Dick, Sam, Amos, Harry, Henry, Barnet, Yellow Jim, Frederick, Joe, Bill, Lydia, Jim, Isaac, Stephen, Ben, Parker, Lydia, Amy, Maria, Alley, Ann, Louisa, Sarah, Helly, Eliza, Jane, Rance, Mary Ann, Maria, and Anna Maria; - and also the following live stock, Chattels and property on the aforesaid Farm, vizt. Twenty Horses, Ten oxen, Four Ox Carts, Three Horse Carts, Sixty head of Cattle, Seventy Head of Sheep, one hundred head of Hogs, Two wheat Gans, Two wheat Rollers, One corn mill, Twenty ploughs, Twelve Scythes and Cradles and all other the farming utensils upon said farm, Also all that Farm, plantation, tract or parcel of Land, containing four hundred and fifty Acres or thereabouts known by the name of his Watson Farm, situated in Norton Neck and Kent County aforesaid adjoining the Lands of Major William Graves Also all that Farm, plantation tract or parcel of Land called and known by the name of his Mill Farm, situated and lying to the right of the road leading from Chester Town to the Lower Church in Kent County aforesaid and adjoining Durns Mill, containing two hundred and forty acres more or less, Also one undivided moiety of Fifty Acres of Land near to the Hospital in the City of Baltimore purchased by James Horrold and others, said Richard Frisby joins James Stirling - Also three Lots of ground situated on East Street near to the May Scales on the East side of Cones's falls in the City of Baltimore lately conveyed to the said Richard Frisby by John Beachbill and others, Together with the improvements upon the same Lands and Lots of ground respectively, made, or being, and all and every the rights, privileges, appurtenances and advantages to the same and every of them belonging or appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders of the same. To hold all and singular, the Lands Lots of Ground, Real Estate, Slaves, Effects and property aforesaid and thereby granted
