in the Manner they aught to have done, in the late Action, made the best of their Way to Brussels; from whence they were feat back under a good Elcort to our Army. The Sentence promonneed against them by the Council of War was, that 3 should be ther, and that 27 of the most culpable should draw Cits. The poor Wretches upon whom the Lot fell, were parconted at the Place of Execution; and the rest escaped with a Wareping. There will be a Court-Martial held To morrow apon fuch Officers as failed in their Dury.

The Report of postponing the Dyet of Election has lost all Credit at Franciert, it being now out of all Doubt that the Grand Duke, who was expected in that Neighbourhood to take eyon him the Command of the Queen's Forces, will be elected to the Imperial Dignity.

Noncastle, Mry 13. His Majesty's Ship the Faulcon, the Hon, John Briningham, Commander, of 6 Nine Pounders, 12 Six Pounders, and about 70 Men, sell in last Tuesday off Flamkorough-Head with a French Privateer of 13 Nine Pounders, 6 Sex Pounders, and about 200 Men; the Faulton fought her feveral Glasses, but Night coming on, they both lay to, and in the Morning renewed the Engagement, when the Privateer hawing lost a great many Men, thought proper to sheer off. The Box Man of War of 20 Guns soon after falling in with the Banken, and being informed of what had happened, immedizely gave Clase to the Privateer, who had not got out of Signs; is that we expect shortly to have a good Account of her. The Fankson would have chaned the Privateer, but that her main Mait was shot through by a Nine Pounder; they durst not proceed, lest they thould carry away their main Mail. None of his Crew 'who all behaved very well were killed, and only two wounded. Capt. Birmingham died foon after of his Wounds: The Fox did not come up with the Enemy; but the was taken two Days after by an English at Gun Ship, and carnied into Variaouta.

Kitts, who brings Advice that a Snow was arrived therein 6 Weeks from London, with an Account, that the English have lately taken 70 Sail of Veffels, among which are 7 French East-India Men: The Master had not Time to learn the Particulars, but we nope it may be confirmed. Tis ander, that the Spaniards have offered to come into aimod any Meadures, in order to have a Peace with the English.

Juguet 12. Thuriday last Cape John Smith, and on Same day Evening Capt. Ala King, arrived nere in 19 Days from Jamaica, the latter of them came our with near 20 Sail of other Veriels bound to this and the neignbouring Governments. The most material Intelligence we can learn by them is, That the Government of Jamaica, on the News of Mr. Caylus's Squadron in the Wen-Indies, being apprehensive of an Anack or an Invation, and having then but few Men of War at that Island, had on the 19th laid an Embargo on all Supping there, and proclaimed Martal Law throughout the fame; which contineed upwards of 3 Weeks, to the great Stagnation of Bulinds and Trade; but that they were now in daily Expediation of having a Reinforcement from England.

I nat about 12 Days before Capt. Smith failed, one of his Majerly's Sloops of War met with and took a French Privates of 16 Carrage Gons and 25 Swivels, full of Men; who shuck without firing a Gun: And in bringing her down to Jamaia, off Port Morant, met with a Spannh Privateer of 6 Carriage and 12 Swivel Guns, which he also mok, and brought then both in together.
