into foreign Countries for his Diversion: and as to'us Flemings of Brabant, we have no other Fears about us, than that this Sovereign or ours should not, in the Heat of his Careffer and zetting of Maidenheads, meet with to brutal Gallantry, which might fend him to fit in the Kingdom of Plute, on the Right-Hand of the Marquels de Fercion, his Emballador."

London, July 29. Letters from Genoa, dated a few Days before the railing of the fiege, take Notice; that not only all the Shops were that up, the Tradesmen being employed in the Defence of the Intrenenments, but that the Clergy had also formed two Battalions, one of 600, and the other of 800 men.
